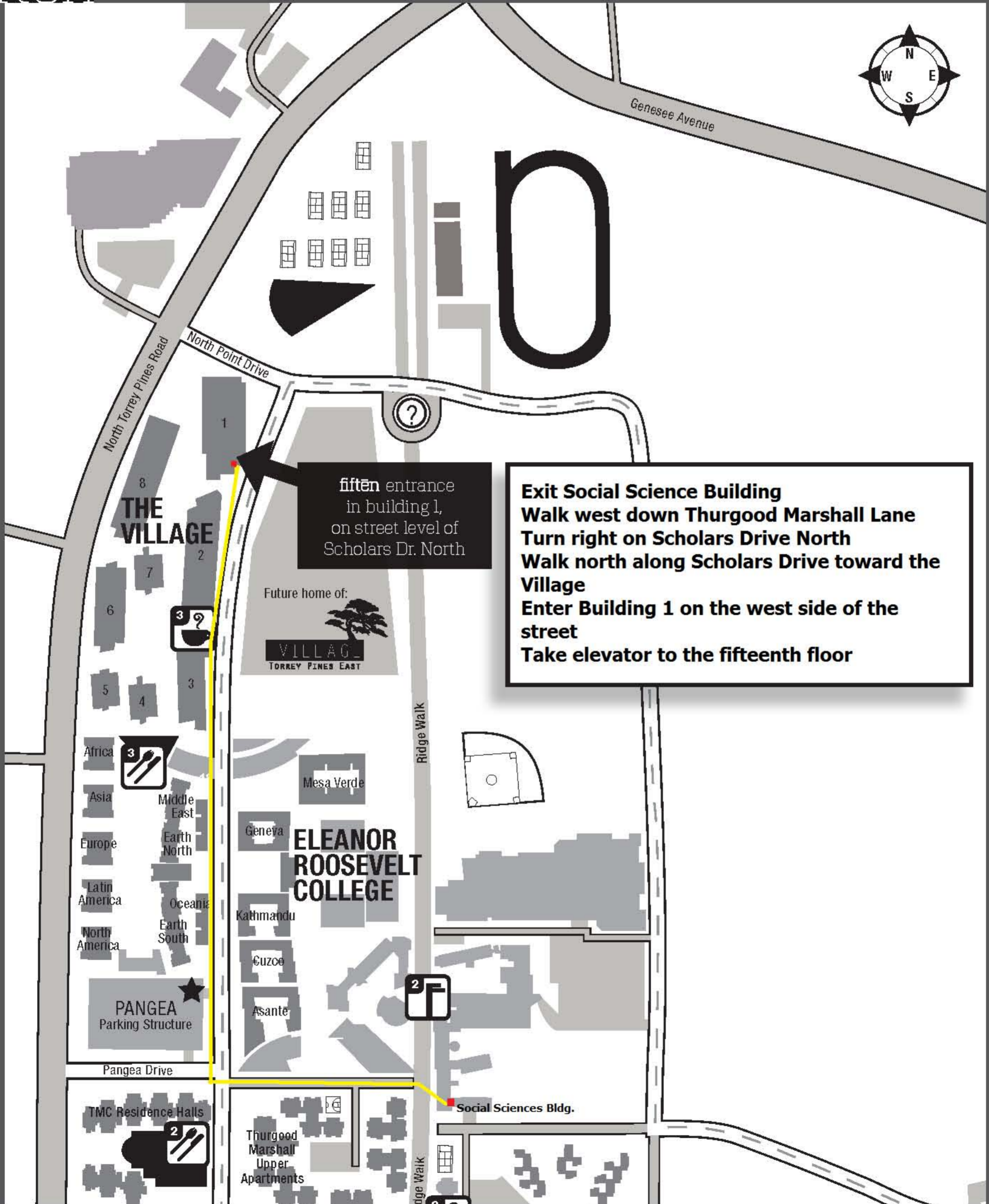
Prof. Edwin Hutchins earned his Ph.D. in Cultural Anthropology and joined the Department of Cognitive Science at UCSD in 1988. Prof. Hutchins studies cognition in real-world settings. His current theoretical interests focus on understanding the ways that cognition is distributed, situated, embodied, and enacted in interactions among people and between people and the material aspects of their settings.

This is the first of the Gusfield Lectures in the Humanities and Social Studies to be presented annually by the UCSD Department of Sociology made possible by Irma Gusfield and Joseph Gusfield, Distinguished Professor Emeritus and founding Chair of the Sociology Department.
