	Once the dissertation is substantially completed and committee members have had the opportunity to review drafts of the written work, the committee meets at least <b>one month</b> before the defense takes place, with or without the student present, to consider the progress made and to identify concerns, changes to be made, or further work to be done. <b>Once</b> <b>the committee members are substantially satisfied with the written</b> <b>work, the student, in consultation with the committee, schedules the</b> <b>oral defense of the dissertation.</b> By university regulation, this defense is open to the public.
