## **Sociology Minor Information**

### **Minor Requirements**

The Sociology minor must consist of seven four-unit courses in Sociology—of which at least five four-unit courses must be upper-division. Courses must be taken for letter grade with a "C-" or better.

#### **Minor Coursework Distribution**

Students may complete their minor in one of the following combinations:

- 2 lower-division, 5 upper-division sociology courses
- 1 lower-division, 6 upper-division sociology courses
- 7 upper-division sociology courses

#### **Declaring a Minor**

You can apply for a minor at any time by using the Major/Minor tool under Academic Links on MyTritonLink.

- Log on to Tritonlink
- Click "Advising and Grades"
- Click "Major and Minor"
- Next to "Declared Minor," click on "ADD"

#### **Special Considerations**

- Maximum of two sociology courses from a community college
- Maximum of one sociology course from study abroad (petition required)
- Maximum of two upper division sociology courses may overlap with student's major
- SOCI 199 is not accepted towards the minor

In order to apply for the minor, students must list all courses they plan to apply towards the minor.

When listing courses on the application, only list course numbers and titles for courses you have completed or are currently enrolled in. Students may list courses not yet completed by using the following template:

#### **Eligible Courses for Minor**

All four unit courses provided by the Department of Sociology may be applied towards the minor (with the exception of SOCI 199). Two upper division sociology courses may overlap with a student's major and minor. However, courses taken at UC San Diego outside of the Sociology Department may not be applied towards the minor. Unless colleges specify specific courses to be taken, the student may choose any two lower-division sociology courses (SOCI 1, 2, 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, or 70) and any upper-division courses (SOCI 100 to 190) following one of the 3 distributions above.
