#### **CalFresh Solidarity Task**

CalFresh is a California State program that provides people with monthly grocery benefits based on need. It's essentially a debit card the government gives you with money in it to purchase food. In 2022, a UCSD survey found that 42% of students experience food insecurity, with even higher rates among groups like Black and transfer students.

Your task is to promote CalFresh on campus. You can do this in multiple ways or come up with your own creative way to spread the word:

- Give a short presentation in one of your classes.
- Create a social media post or video directed at UCSD students.
- Talk one-on-one or in a small group with fellow students.
- Get creative and do anything else that helps spread the message!

At a minimum, your message should cover:

- 1. What CalFresh is.
- 2. That the Basic Needs Hub on campus can help students determine eligibility and assist with applying.
- 3. Emphasize that it's their right to access this program.

Once you've completed the task, upload a message to the assignment tab on Canvas describing how you promoted CalFresh and attach any materials you created. I've uploaded a slide to Canvas about the program that you're welcome to use or modify.

**Bonus:** If you take the extra step and help another student fill out their application, I'll personally treat you to a lunch or dinner of your choice at the end of the quarter!
